



## Supervisor Jeffries' Board Report

April 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2019

This week's Board meeting was very short, with no regular items pulled for discussion (there was one non-controversial planning hearing). Two items of note for the County and the 1<sup>st</sup> District were:

**Paving of Covell Road in Woodcrest—Item 3.25 (No discussion)** As part of my continuing efforts to pave rural dirt roads wherever practical and cost effective, this item approved the paving of Covell Street in Woodcrest from Cole Avenue to Barton Street. A portion of the funding for this street paving comes directly from my own office budget, showing the priority I put on these sorts of projects. We have also been told that the roads surrounding Covell are scheduled for major maintenance shortly.

**Comments/Presentations—Item 17 Census 2020 Call to Action (Video Time Stamp 37:15)** Supervisor Perez (4<sup>th</sup> District) sponsored a presentation about next year's census. Officials from the state and federal government came to talk about the importance of the "Complete Count" program, which focuses on the more marginalized communities to be sure that everyone is represented in the total numbers within Riverside County to the US Census. Citizen or non-citizen, young or old, rich or poor, male, female, etc., all individuals counted are used in the allocation of legislative seats (including how many Congressional seats California gets as a whole) as well as a variety of state and federal funding formulas for social services, infrastructure, and other programs over the following decade. Elsewhere on today's agenda (Item 3.8), we approved a funding agreement with the Complete Count Census 2020 Committee, wherein they will provide Riverside County with \$1.2 million for outreach programs.
