Fires, Floods, Flowers - Back to Fires? The corridor between Corona and Lake Elsinore has had more than its share of challenging issues over the past 12 months. The most recent problems for residents of the Temescal Valley and Lake Elsinore Valley has been the poppy viewing tourists, and the havoc it has been wreaking on roads in the area and traffic on the freeway. Somewhere between 20,000 and 50,000 tourists show up each day on the weekends to take in nature's spectacular show. This massive bloom is thought to be the result of the very heavy rains that occurred during our recent winter storms. The problem that comes next will be the very thick and tall weeds that will be prime fuel for our 2019 fire season. If we continue to enjoy warm weather, I anticipate that the 2019 fire season is just around the corner. So, break out your weed-eater, hire the neighborhood teenager, or find a weed abatement contractor – just make sure those tall weeds are mowed-down to give our local firefighters (and your home) a fighting chance!

<u>Do It Yourself Restaurants?</u> For the past several years, brick & mortar restaurants have been keeping a watchful eye on the growing popularity of food trucks in Riverside County. Some of the restaurant owners found that it made good business sense to operate both a restaurant and a food truck. Now comes another state approved entry into the retail food fight: Home based restaurants! State Assembly Bill 626 was signed into law in September 17, 2018 by then Governor Jerry Brown, which provides for retail food sales directly from home-based kitchens. If you love the concept of giving new entrepreneurs a chance at the American dream, this bill (and food) is for you! But if you want to make sure the food you buy and consume is as safe as it can be... well.... this budding home kitchen industry might not be for you. Your County Environmental Health Department will NOT be allowed (by State law) to inspect and regulate this new industry like it does restaurants and food trucks. The home-based kitchen can only be subjected to one (1) regular inspection per year and it must be scheduled in advance, and if the Health Department receives public complaints about bad food or sanitary issues – the resulting onsite investigation must also be scheduled in advance with the operator. Home based kitchen businesses are also NOT going to have letter grades, so caveat emptor!

For those of you who enjoy the road-side food truck menus, just make sure the truck/trailer/stand has both a County health permit and a letter grade posted in plain sight. You'll be rewarding the businesses that are doing it the right way, and your stomach will thank you later!

Time To Volunteer? Your county government has a number of volunteer opportunities. Some require a specific set of skills or training while others would be happy to have you just lend a hand. Many cities also have various opportunities to help make a difference. For those of you who live in (or near) unincorporated (non-city) communities, our office is looking for able-bodied individuals who would be willing to train and serve with our Emergency Management Department as local Disaster Response Team volunteers. We need a few good men and women (well maybe 15 to 20) in many of our unincorporated communities to help provide support services during fires, floods, earthquakes and even poppy blooms! 



2020 Citizens Redistricting Commission

Please see special message below from the California State Auditor's Office:

Every ten years, after the federal census, California must re-establish the boundaries of its Congressional, State Senate, State Assembly and State Board of Equalization districts to reflect new population data and shifting populations. The Voters FIRST Act gave this power to California citizens ensuring that new and fair political boundaries are drawn without special interests, politics and political influence, by creating a 14-member Citizens Redistricting Commission.

California citizens who are eligible may submit an application to the California State Auditor's Office during the initial 60-day application period from June 10, 2019, to August 9, 2019.

This is your chance to become a part of creating fair and transparent district boundaries that serve the best interests of the people of California. If you believe politics are better when all sides work together and you have a passion for civic engagement, apply to become one of 14 new 2020 commissioners.

Voters gave the responsibility of implementing the selection process to form each commission to the California State Auditor. Please sign up to ensure you stay up to date on the latest activities related to the 2020 Citizens Redistricting Commission selection process.
