3.1 Riverside County Sheriff's Department –

- Deputy Arnold: December 2022, 345 Calls, November 2022 380 calls.

3.2 – Riverside County Fire Department – Captain Esparza– Fire Station #9

- December averaged 200 calls in Good Hope alone.
- Sandbags will be available by bay 3.
- Station #9 will be getting a new engine in the springs.

4.0 Public Comments: Those who wish to address the MAC should complete a “Request to Speak” form and give it to the Secretary, completed. Speakers wishing to address items on the agenda should note the agenda item on the speaker’s slip and will be asked to speak at that time. Speakers have a 3–minute time limit.

- First speaker, Jackie McDonald (Senior Committee President):

1. Locked Parking Lot Door: The parking lot door is locked on the 2nd Tuesday each month. Forcing community members, some old and handicapped, some on canes, others on walkers to walk completely around the building to the door closest to the fire station. All community members sign up at this door, get a number, then allowed in the center to have a seat until their number is called. This happens for the Feeding America food distribution. Feed America informed a senior committee member that they make no deliveries to Good Hope.

2. Relationships between Restoration Agape and certain community members have become very adversarial, causing both emotional and mental distress – which can be a form of elder abuse. Asycologist is willing to send a letter to the county if deemed necessary.

I wish my entire statement to become a part o the minutes as presented. My most important statement at the meeting November 3, 2022 Restoration Agape informed seniors at the center they [Restoration Agape] were not here for us – they were here to serve the lord.

- Michele Campbell: I live in the Meadowbrook area, I already addressed the issues I have in the area. There’s an increase of noise is just disturbing. I have neighbors disrespect the quietness of being outside. I would just like code enforcement to address these calls. I know sheriff is on more important calls. I just want more help from code enforcement and sheriff. Unfortunately, I am unable to move, I have tried. My job is to make my community quieter and safer.

- Malaika Davis: On Christmas Eve and NYE, not only were they shooting regular guns, and fireworks, they were letting off machine guns. This was the first year they started shooting machine guns until 4am. In NYE, it wasn’t that bad, they probably stopped around 10 or 11 ish. I would like to say that I was calling, and my sister was calling. When I would just call, they were very insensitive, I know what a machine gun sounds like. It sounded like I was bothering them. I know it’s the holidays and people are very busy. It’s just a simple form of courtesy. I know what a machine gun sounds like. They are not customer service friendly. It was coming off Spring and Olive up that hill. A guy did come out and speak to my sister on NYE, on NYE, just not on Christmas EVE. A suggestion I’d like to make, can there be funds in the budget to have someone in the area for the holidays.
