# **Kevin's Corner**

A quick recap of issues and challenges....

Animals & Technology - As previously reported, local governments are facing statewide mandates to start converting their automotive fleets to electric vehicles. One of the many challenges for our Department of Animal Services is the special utility trucks they utilize requires specialized air conditioning systems to keep captured animals cool and safe while being transported to regional animal shelter facilities (in a county as large as ours that can be a very long ride). With the on-board air conditioning essentially running full time the electric truck would quickly drain the battery system and potentially endanger the animals. Unfortunately, unlike emergency response vehicles, there is NO exemption for animal control trucks. Stay tuned because this is just one of many Red Flags as these regulations kick in.

Brace for Fire Season – Some disturbing news. <a href="http://californiacountynews.org/news/2023/05/these-10-counties-will-face-greatest-wildfire-risk-fall">http://californiacountynews.org/news/2023/05/these-10-counties-will-face-greatest-wildfire-risk-fall</a> has reported that Riverside County ranks 5<sup>th</sup> out of 58 counties on the list of most likely counties to experience severe wildland fire risk this fall. My efforts to have two of our county Sheriff Department helicopters outfitted (and pilots trained) to provide mutual aid water dropping capabilities was recently defeated (even though Sheriff helicopters in San Diego, San Bernardino, and Orange Counties all offer their residents with this critical service). I am not giving up on efforts to improve wildfire readiness, though, and am hoping that a forthcoming budget proposal to beef up many of our county fire engines with extra fire season staffing will soon be approved.

Labor Shortages Hit Vital Services - it was just a few months ago that I covered the very serious conditions involving staffing shortages and long response delays with our contract (paramedic) ambulance provider for our county and nearly every city. Preliminary reports indicate that the situation is still NOT improving. County and City fire engines (with firefighter paramedic staffing) are still having to be placed out of service because the ambulance is not showing up to serious emergencies with a paramedic on board, thereby causing the fire dept, paramedic to un-staff the fire engine and move over to the ambulance and travel to the hospital and remain with the patient until the hospital can find a bed and admit them (which is often a significant delay at a few understaffed hospitals). On top of the paramedic shortage, we also have at least one trash collection company that continues to also face staff shortages of trash truck drivers, which then causes neighborhood trash services to be significantly impacted. Residents and firefighters are becoming very tired and upset with these ongoing staffing challenges. These privately held companies are going to have to quickly figure out effective solutions in order to avoid government intervention.

**Full Court Press Update #2** – You may recall the large number of criminal cases that were being dismissed in Riverside County because of a lack of Judges (and court rooms) to hear the cases, and that State Senator Richard Roth had introduced SB 75 to help the Inland Empire gain more judges. Our local ratio of judicial officers per 100,000 residents is 3.4, compared to a statewide average 11.4. SB 75 is currently on the Consent Calendar and should pass the floor of the Senate this week. The Governor's current budget proposal does not include funding for new judges, but Senator Roth is working on including it in the legislative version of the budget.

Tax & Travel? RCTC, the countywide transportation commission (a separate entity from "The County"), has attempted to be aggressive in building or expanding our (State-owned) freeways & highways – so long as Cal-Trans regulators would allow it – and provided RCTC could find the needed funding (hence why we have those dreaded Toll lanes). But even with those toll revenues and an existing local transportation tax, RCTC is running out of revenues to keep up with our rapidly growing population (30,000 a year +/-) and skyrocketing construction costs, and is looking at a possible new tax/fee to keep building those expensive roads. One proposal in Sacramento is AB 1385 which would allow Riverside County voters to approve an additional sales tax increase to fund infrastructure. More to come.

Can You Help? On the next page you will see where we (County) have a number of vacancies to serve on various community or countywide commissions. Please take a look and see if you might be a good fit to serve on one of the many positions that are open. Government is only as good as the people who help guide it.



# Mead Valley Urban Tree Program





On Saturday, April 29th we had our first Mead Valley Shade Tree Giveaway! The program consists of a distribution of 1,000 trees using the allocated resources from the Environmental Justice funds through which residents, schools, county facilities and businesses within the Mead Valley community will receive shade trees to plant on their properties to further offset the impact of nearby logistics and warehousing projects.

320 trees were distributed to 106 families in the Mead Valley with the help of TreePeople, an environmental 501(c)3 organization, that has been involved in developing and implementing nature-based solutions to pressing problems that impact communities and ecosystems across Southern California.


