Kevin's Corner – Holiday Edition

Decision Time! It seems like just yesterday, but in February 2021 your Board of Supervisors unanimously appointed Jeff Van Wagenen to become the new County Chief Executive Officer of one of the fastest growing counties in California (4th largest by population in California and 10th largest in the USA) with over 23,000 employees and 40+ county departments serving nearly 2.5 million residents. Fast forward and his three-year contract is already coming up and the Board will soon begin new contract negotiations. Generally, I'd say good economic fortune has followed Jeff as our CEO (except for that dark period of COVID). Recruiting for highly trained or specialized positions has proven difficult for nearly all organizations, and Riverside County is no different. One of Van Wagenen's "faults" is that he is a true data nerd. He has charts and graphs for every department that tells him hirings, firings, resignations, budgets – everything! With all the growth-related pressures bearing down heavily on county services, tightening budgets and critical labor negotiations around the corner – he will be earning his pay if a deal is reached.

Quick Community Updates.... A number of community improvements are underway or soon will be:

Mead Valley: Sidewalks are being installed to connect our schools, library, and community center and, streetlights are being installed on some of our busiest roads in this growing but rural community to help. We've also funded the paving of a couple dirt connector roads, and you should see some new covered bus shelters installed shortly. A new fire "patrol" vehicle is on order for the local fire station, and a multi-agency task force will soon be assembling to help tackle the homeless camps and needed services. The Mead Valley community center will also be hosting a Breakfast with Santa on Saturday December 9th starting at 9am.

Good Hope / Meadowbrook: Vacant land next to the community center and park has been acquired which will someday allow the park to double in size. Sidewalks between the school and community center are on the way, as well as a 4-way stop at Steele Peak and Palm to improve pedestrian safety, as well paving a few more dirt roads to improve connectivity and reduce road dust. The Good Hope Breakfast with Santa will be Saturday, December 16th from 9am-1pm.

Highgrove: Improvements are in the works for the community center (replacing the very old HVAC system) and on Center Street, where re-paving and pedestrian/bike safety improvements will be installed, and a new sidewalk will soon be constructed on Michigan Ave near the school, library, and community center. A new multi-agency task force is also being mobilized to work on homeless camps and other needed services.

Lakeland Village: The community center will be hosting a "Jingle Bell Rock" event and Christmas tree Lighting ceremony on Friday December 8th from 3-6pm, and the groundbreaking ceremony for the new sports park above the community center will happen on Saturday December 9th at 10am.

Riverside County Flash Vote!

Do you have one minute a month to help make Riverside County better? The County of Riverside is working with FlashVote to gather valuable input from residents to inform decisions on programs, policies and budget. The sign-up process takes less than one minute and the individual information collected by FlashVote is never shared with the County, nor anyone else. When residents sign up, they can determine if they want to receive the surveys by email, text or phone. Residents will receive a notification whenever there is a new survey, and they will have 48 hours to participate before voting closes. Once a survey is closed, everyone who participated will automatically receive a summary of the overall results and be able to see how their responses compare to the group. Results are anonymous. Residents with trailers will be directed to the landfill/transfer station to unload themselves. * Per State law, you must have a tire manifest to transport over 9 tires and tires must be less than 4 feet in diameter.


