II. Roll Call

III. Approval of Minutes

- A. Sept. 19, 2015 TVMAC meeting minutes approved with a small change to line item three for the sheriff's report. (Bob Hafner motions to approve with corrections, Jerry Sincich seconded).

IV. Reports

- A. Sheriff's Department – Lt. Pemberton
1. Discussed stats for September
 2. 292 calls to service. Down significantly.
 3. Part one crimes September had 0 robberies, 3 assaults, 14 thefts, 6 burglaries, 4 vehicle thefts, and 0 arson.
 4. Crime on a whole went down 25% from previous month.
 5. 14 arrest: 2 for domestic violence, 1 for unlawful touching, 1 for a physical altercation between two individuals, 1 for felony theft, 2 arrest for outstanding warrants, 1 for criminal threat
 6. Did a call onto Bedford canyon with some call of burning materials.
- B. Update from CAL Fire – Capt. Jim Brown
1. Above normal for large fire chance until mid November.
 2. Forecast looking for more wetter weather
 3. The rain looks to primarily looking for Southern California
 4. 104 incidences. Down from previous month. 70 in medical
 5. 6.1 minutes for call
 6. Meeting 5.0 arrival time percentage
 7. Remind to have smoking detectors outside sleeping areas
 8. Check batteries twice a year
 9. Replace smoke detectors after 10 years
 10. Talked about the Shakeout Drill on October 15.
- C. Office of Melissa Melendez – Denni Horn
1. Legislation is ended for the year
 2. 4 pieces of legislation that has been enacted into law:
 - 1.State Highway 74 relinquishment bill
 - 2.Continue education units for AED training in public school
 - 3.Domestic violence (convicted of mister meaner domestic violence and felony domestic assault) charges on individual should be imprisoned no less than 48 hours.
 - 4.Fire transfer bill
 3. Special group developed 9 point plan to help develop high way infrastructure. It did not make budget priority this year
 4. Offered bill to give tax credit if you remove turf for the drought. This was killed in assembly.

5. Called for an audit of plan parenthood to ensure the funds is going to the appropriate place. This was killed because majority party did not agree with the call to an audit.
6. SP277 – requires vaccination of student before school. She voted against because she thought there were better ways to encourage vaccination instead of withholding education.
7. She is in district until the first of the year
8. She will be doing coffee in meetings in October, November, and December. Check her website for exact dates
9. Talked about a few changes in her office.
10. There were questions on what can we do to retain and storage of water. Only discussions going on at this time.

V. New Business

- A. Western Water District and EVMWD – Al Lopez and Nancy Horton
 - a. Started off with raffle and questions in reference to amount of water to grow vegetables and ways to conserve.
- B. Riverside County Transportation Committee – Ann Meyer
 - a. Talk about updates to Temescal Road
 - b. Talked about audit of incident happening at I-91 and Grand Avenue incident. OSHA and CALTRANS and Walsh construction doing investigations. Ongoing investigation.
 - c. Talked about I-15
 - i. Two toll lanes to open to Cajalco. In 2012 made judgment to shorten project due to funding. Project smaller because higher congestion north of Cajalco
 - ii. Went over access point for “Toll road
 - iii. 2016 put out to bid, start construction 2018 finish 2020
 - iv. Next project from south Cajalco to I-74. Basically, if had the money the earliest it would be done is 2025. We obviously don’t have money
 - v. Telling elected officials to have improvement to be done by 2019,
 - d. In the interim what can we do
 - i. Freeway service patrol. These are paid assistance to help stranded automobiles
 - ii. Metered ramps (Weirick and Temescal Canyon Road)(El Cerrito, and Ontario and one other ramp)
 - iii. Answered questions on the freeway improvements.
 1. Talked about RCTC put lawsuit because of World Logistic center in Moreno valley because of no considering roads and highway improvements.
 2. Talked for traffic issues of getting kids to Corona/Norco School.
 - iv. Temescal Canyon Road (Juan Perez) improvement (RCTC and County of Riverside is working to get this project done). What we can build soon and give us the most bangs for our buck.
 1. Widening in several points Widen about 5 miles of road.
 2. Adding turn lanes at Lawson and Hostetler
 3. See county website for further details
 4. Also, mentioned Cajalco improvements. Discussed how money is earned and spent on this project and for I-15/ I-91.
 5. Answering questions.
- C. Contractor Storage Yard (across from Lee Lake) – Trip Ford

- a. Peterson/Chase contractor supplies engineering and structural support for these highway projects
- b. Operating there for one year. Purchased from other contractor company
- c. Got temp using permit for his storage k rails and drainage apparatus and cushioning barrels
- d. No storage of heavy equipment and vehicles.
- e. Applied for plot plan for using storage yard. Listen to WeRTV and TMAC to lower K-rail and get lower from eliminating area for graffiti.
- f. They will also come out weekly to clean off graffiti and lower stacks.
- g. Put in plans to limit 5 -7 years for storage and then to apply for installation of construction building possibly in the future.
